1965 WISCONSIN OFFICERS*INTRODUCTION

This Informational Bulletin is a compilation of information about the 1965 Wisconsin legislators and other elective state officials. It consists of the following 3 parts:

Part I: Profile of the 1965 Legislature--a summary of data on the legislators' party affiliations, legislative status, experience in local public office, ages, occupations, education and military service. A comparative table, "Personal Data on Wisconsin Legislators, 1957-1965"; is included.

Part II: List by Office and District, 1965 Wisconsin Officers--a roster of the Legislators and U.S. Congressmen by district, and of the Supreme Court Justices, the Governor and other state officers by office. Mailing address, elective status and party (except for non-partisan offices) are given.

Six election district maps follow Part II: maps of the new state congressional districts and the new Milwaukee County Congressional districts, created by Chapter 63, Laws of 1963; maps of the new state Senate districts, the new state Assembly districts and the new Milwaukee County Senate and Assembly districts, as reapportioned by the State Supreme Court 5/14/64; and a map showing the old odd-numbered Senate districts as they existed prior to the 1964 reapportionment, which are still represented by the holdover Senators whose terms will not expire until 1967.

Part III: Brief Biographies, 1965 Wisconsin Officers--personal details in brief for the individual state officers, Supreme Court justices, Congressmen and Legislators, listed alphabetically. Facts include district, party (except for nonpartisan offices), elective status, birth date, marital status, occupation, education, military service and mailing address.

Sources used for information were questionnaires sent out by the Wisconsin Legislative Reference Bureau, newspaper stories concerning the election of November 3, 1964, and the Wisconsin Blue Book.

MAY 1965 ADDENDA TO INFORMATIONAL BULLETIN 64-9

The resignation of Senator Lynn E. Stalbaum after his election to Congress in November, 1964, and the death of Assemblyman Allen J. Flannigan, February 17, 1965, created legislative vacancies that were filled at special spring elections. Senator Henry Dorman, 21st Senate district, was elected 3/9/65; Assemblyman William A. Johnson, Milwaukee Co. 7th Assembly District, was elected 5/4/65. Brief biographies of the two new legislators follow:

Dorman, Henry; 21st Sen. District; Dem.; 1st session; born 9/24/16; married; attorney; LL.B. U. of Wis.; World War II veteran; 422 Sixteenth St., Racine.

Johnson, William A.; Milwaukee 7th Assem. district; Dem.; 1st session; born 2/3/22; married; machinist; World War II veteran; 3403 N. 22nd St., Milwaukee.

Part I: PROFILE OF THE 1965 LEGISLATURE
Summary of Personal Data of Members

THE SENATE PROFILE

The Senate has 33 members. As the 1965 Legislature begins, there are 20 Republicans, 12 Democrats, and one vacancy. All the Senators are men; Wisconsin has never had a woman Senator.

Twelve Senators were re-elected; 15 are holdover Senators. Five did not serve in the 1963 session, including 2 who served in previous Assembly sessions and 3 new to the Legislature.

Six Senators have had previous experience in 10 or more legislative sessions, 10 have served in 5 to 9 sessions, and 13 have served in less than 5 sessions. Senator Allen J. Busby has the longest legislative experience, having served 16 sessions, including 2 in the Assembly. Of the 12 Senators now in their first 4-year senatorial term, 6 will complete their first full term at the end of the 1965 session.

Twenty-six Senators have had experience in local public office; 11 have held local public office at both the municipal and county level. One Senator has served as mayor, 11 served on county boards (3 as chairmen), 6 served as city council members (one as president) and 4 served as town chairmen. Four Senators served as city or village attorneys, 4 as school board members, and 11 have held miscellaneous other city or town offices. Many Senators held a variety of local public offices. Six, including one new Senator, have had no previous experience in public office.

The average age of Senators is 55.72 years. The most numerous age group is over 65 years with 13 Senators, followed by the 46-55 year group with 7 members, the 36-45 year group with 6 members, the 56-65 year group with 4 members, and 2 Senators less than 35 years old. The oldest Senator, Jess Miller, 27th District, is 80 years old. The youngest, Martin Schreiber, 6th District, is 25. All ages are listed as of January 1, 1965.

Ten Senators are attorneys, 7 are farmers. Five deal in insurance or real estate and 6 in miscellaneous other business lines. Two are industrial workers, and there is one industrial executive, one public relations representative and one locomotive fireman-engineer. Four Senators are retired and one is semiretired.

Eleven Senators have attended the University of Wisconsin, 5 attended Wisconsin state colleges. Six attended Marquette University, one went to Lawrence College. Seven attended out-of-state colleges and universities. Fifteen hold academic degrees. Seven Senators received some business or technical education beyond high school, and 5 received no education beyond high school.

Sixteen Senators served in the nation's armed forces, including one who served in both World Wars, and 2 who served with both the Army and the Air Force in World War II and the Korean conflict. Ten served in the Army, 3 in the Navy, 2 in the Air Force, 2 in the Army Air Corps, one in the Marine Corps and one in the Coast Guard. Three Senators are veterans of World War I, one served in both World Wars, 7 served in World War II, and 4 served in both World War II and the Korean conflict.

THE ASSEMBLY PROFILE

The Assembly has 100 members. In the 1965 Legislature, 52 Assemblymen are Democrats and 48 are Republicans. Two members of the 1965 Assembly are women.

Seventy Assemblymen were re-elected, 28 are serving their first term in the Assembly, and 2 have served in earlier Assembly sessions. Fourteen Assemblymen have had previous legislative experience in 5 or more legislative sessions. The Assemblyman with the longest legislative experience is George Molinaro, Kenosha County 1st district, who has served in 9 consecutive sessions. Nine Assemblymen have served 4 sessions, 9 have served 3 sessions, 23 have served 2 sessions, and 17 have served one prior session in the Assembly.

Sixty-one Assemblymen (including 17 new members) have had experience in local public office; of this number 32 (including 12 new members) have held office at both the county and municipal level, and many Assemblymen have held a variety of local public offices. Including 13 new members, 39 have held no local public office.

Thirty-three Assemblymen have served on county boards (3 as chairmen), 11 served as city council members (one as president), 6 served as village board members (one as village president), 15 served as town board members (11 as town chairmen), 8 served as school board members (3 as chairmen). Three Assemblymen have served as mayors, 3 as city attorneys, 3 as town clerks, 2 as justices of the peace, and 11 have held miscellaneous other municipal offices.

Election to the Assembly means the first public office for 13 of the 28 Assemblymen without prior legislative experience. Of the other new Assemblymen, 9 have served on county boards, 4 have served on city councils, 2 on village boards (one as president), 4 on town boards (3 as chairmen), 3 on school boards (one as chairman). One new Assemblyman has served as mayor, one as district attorney, one as city attorney, one as town clerk, and 5 have held miscellaneous other municipal offices.

The average age of Assemblymen is 46.69 years. The most numerous age group is 46-55 years with 31 members, followed by the 36-45 year group with 27 members, the 56-65 year group with 19 members, the 26-35 year group with 17 members. Two Assemblymen are 25 or less, and 4 are over 65. The oldest Assemblyman, Edward F. Mertz, Milwaukee County 9th District, is 74 years old. The youngest, Frederick P. Kessler, Milwaukee County 10th District, is 24. All ages are listed as of January 1, 1965.

Eighteen Assemblymen are farmers, 17 are attorneys. Fifteen deal in insurance or real estate and 21 in miscellaneous other business lines. Seven are industrial workers, 4 are industrial executives, 4 are teachers, 4 are college students. Three Assemblymen are listed as accountants, 3 as financial institution officials and 3 in engineering. One Assemblyman is listed in each of these categories: Deputy sheriff, housewife, optometrist, public relations representative, surveyor, and watchmaker. Four Assemblymen are retired and one is semiretired.

Forty-three Assemblymen have attended the University of Wisconsin, 10 attended state colleges, and 2 attended county normal schools. Thirteen Assemblymen attended Marquette University, 5 attended private colleges and universities in Wisconsin, and 19 attended out-of-state colleges and universities. Forty-four Assemblymen hold academic degrees. Seventeen

Assemblymen received some business or technical school education beyond high school. Twenty-four Assemblymen received no education beyond high school.

Forty-seven Assemblymen served in the nation's armed forces, including one who served in both the Army and the Navy in World War II.

Thirty-one Assemblymen served in the Army, 10 in the Navy, 2 in the Marine Corps, and 5 in the Army Air Corps. One Assemblyman is a veteran of World War I, 33 are veterans of World War II, 3 are veterans of the Korean conflict, one is a veteran of both World War II and the Korean conflict, and 7 served in the armed forces during peacetime.






