INTRODUCTION

A year ago through the efforts of a half dozen people a partial and pioneering inventory of about 300 studies concerning Wisconsin, which had been completed recently or which would be completed shortly, was prepared. While there was no overwhelming demand for the resulting document nor any public acclamation for those who did the job, it became fairly apparent that there was in this state a solid core of people who sensed the values of a procedure whereby all the hands might know what all the other hands had done or were currently up to.

We hope that the publication of this second edition will set the pattern and that an ever increasing number of people will become aware of the wide variety of studies being made and the desirability of co-operating in listing them at least once each year. We feel reasonably certain that there are several hundred other studies which should be incorporated into such a list.
