INTRODUCTION

Early in 1958 an ad hoc committee of state officials and employes was assembled to give consideration to a proposal by Dr. Roy Colbert of the University Bureau for Community Development to create a state council of applied research. This committee recognized the need for improved communications among the many agencies of state government in particular and agencies in general, with research capabilities, but without further study was not prepared to recommend a full-blown agency in this field. The committee recommended that those in the state service intimately concerned with the research function be polled in an effort to secure their reactions to the type of co-ordination, liaison or communications which they felt would be most acceptable at this time.

A meeting of 27 representatives of 21 agencies was held, and while they sensed a long-range need for a more formal procedure for handling the research program of the state, they felt that it should be approached cautiously. They recommended the revival of a process carried out in 1954 and 1955 for the compilation of a research inventory in an effort to acquaint the agencies of the state with what has been done and is being done. This proposal was approved by the original committee.

Many people and agencies have recognized the problem of communications in the area of research. The ever-increasing thirst for facts and the continuous expansion of research requires that some machinery be created to make certain that the right hand knows what the left hand is doing. Not only does widespread information regarding research which has been done facilitate the understanding of and operation of government processes, but it may prevent both costly duplication and incomplete studies. The Wisconsin Committee on Community Organization has long been interested in this problem. The Bureau of Government of the University has explored the devices which might improve the knowledge of research projects. The Division of Departmental Research has pointed out the lack of both general knowledge of and a state-wide policy regarding research activities. The Legislative Reference Library prepared 2 exploratory summaries of research activities in 1954 and 1955. There are no doubt others who are equally concerned about the problems of research.

There is no agreement as to what constitutes research. In fact, it is apparent that a multitude of sins have been encompassed by the word. "Research" is probably a technique or series of techniques used to ferret out the facts, and the particular techniques may vary with the nature of the subject matter being worked on. It does not necessarily follow that the results must be voluminous or provide an earth-shaking solution to a world-wide problem.

Obviously a report of each bit of basic and applied research conducted in Wisconsin would be a tremendous task. Much of certain types of research is currently reported in the scientific journals. Some limitations were necessary if the summary was to be assembled in reportable form. When the decision was made to initiate a

semiannual inventory of research, it was determined to include all items which have a present or potential effect upon the legislative or administrative operations of government. It is within these broad limitations that the current listings were made.

It should be pointed out that this compilation is a labor of love. The information was provided by the many agencies of state government out of the goodness of their hearts. The compilations were made by the Bureau of Government of the University and the Legislative Reference Library co-operatively on a volunteer basis in an effort to get the program into motion.

Current plans contemplate that a compilation will be issued at least semiannually and that it will gradually evolve into a report containing 4 parts, namely:

1. Studies completed since the last report;
2. Studies underway;
3. A cumulative listing of recurring basic information reported by state agencies;
4. A cumulative listing of agencies and individuals in the state service prepared to advise on and conduct research projects.

PART I. Research projects with some relationship to the legislative or administrative operations of Wisconsin units of government completed since 1956 or currently under way.

The following list of completed research projects is arranged in alphabetical order by subject. Each listing includes:

1. The title;
2. A very brief statement of the nature of the study if the title is not self-explanatory;

Forest Soils Research. Research in the management of soils in the tree nurseries of the state and soils management on forest lands devoted to timber production. Financed by the Conservation Commission and performed by the University Agricultural Experiment Station. Progress reports are published annually by the Agricultural Experiment Station.

Forest Tree Disease Research. Investigation of the identifications, methods of transmission and development of control measures of the more important diseases affecting forest trees in Wisconsin. Financed by the Conservation Commission and performed by the University Agricultural Experiment Station. Progress reports are published annually by the Agricultural Experiment Station.

Forest Insect Research. Investigations on insect taxonomy, classification and identification; silvicultural, biological and chemical control methods. Financed by the Conservation Commission and performed by the University Agricultural Experiment Station. Progress reports are published annually by the Agricultural Experiment Station.

Forest Genetics. Development of trees having desirable inherited characteristics and is aimed at providing seed of superior quality for use in the state tree nurseries. Financed by the Conservation Commission and performed by the University Agricultural Experiment Station. Progress reports published annually by Agricultural Experiment Station.

Forest Game and Range Research. Concerned with deer, ruffed grouse, prairie grouse, beaver, otter and black bear. Forest game habitat relationships are emphasized with particular attention paid to means of integrating game management with existing forestry and other forest-area land-use practices. Farm Game and Range Research. Directed primarily toward pheasant habitat management, including the importance of wetlands. Other studies are to be concerned with cottontails, squirrels, quail and Hungarian partridge. (See prior entries for specific reports)

Wetlands Game and Range Research. Units study waterfowl and fur. Major efforts include investigations of restoration and management methods for ducks, geese and muskrats with emphasis on habitat problems. (See prior entries for specific reports)

Game and Range Survey Research. Included are the design and evaluation of game and game habitat surveys needed for management and harvest regulations. This project also provides statistical design and analysis services for other game and fish research projects in the Conservation Department.

Wildlife Pathology Research. Work with public health and livestock sanitation agencies, and does independent research to prevent transmission from wildlife of such diseases as rabies, leptospirosis and tularemia. Autopsy of wildlife specimens suspected of carrying diseases, blood serology and parasite studies are other project functions. (See prior entries for specific reports)

Pathology and Nutrition (Fish). Feeding of experimental diets in trout hatcheries to improve quality of hatchery trout.

Warm-water Research (Fish). Six specific studies including research on muskellunge propagation in ponds, carp-largemouthed bass relationships, evaluation of liberalized angling regulations, research on management of lake sturgeon, evaluation of intensive commercial removal of drum (sheepshead) and evaluation of walleye fingerling stocking.
